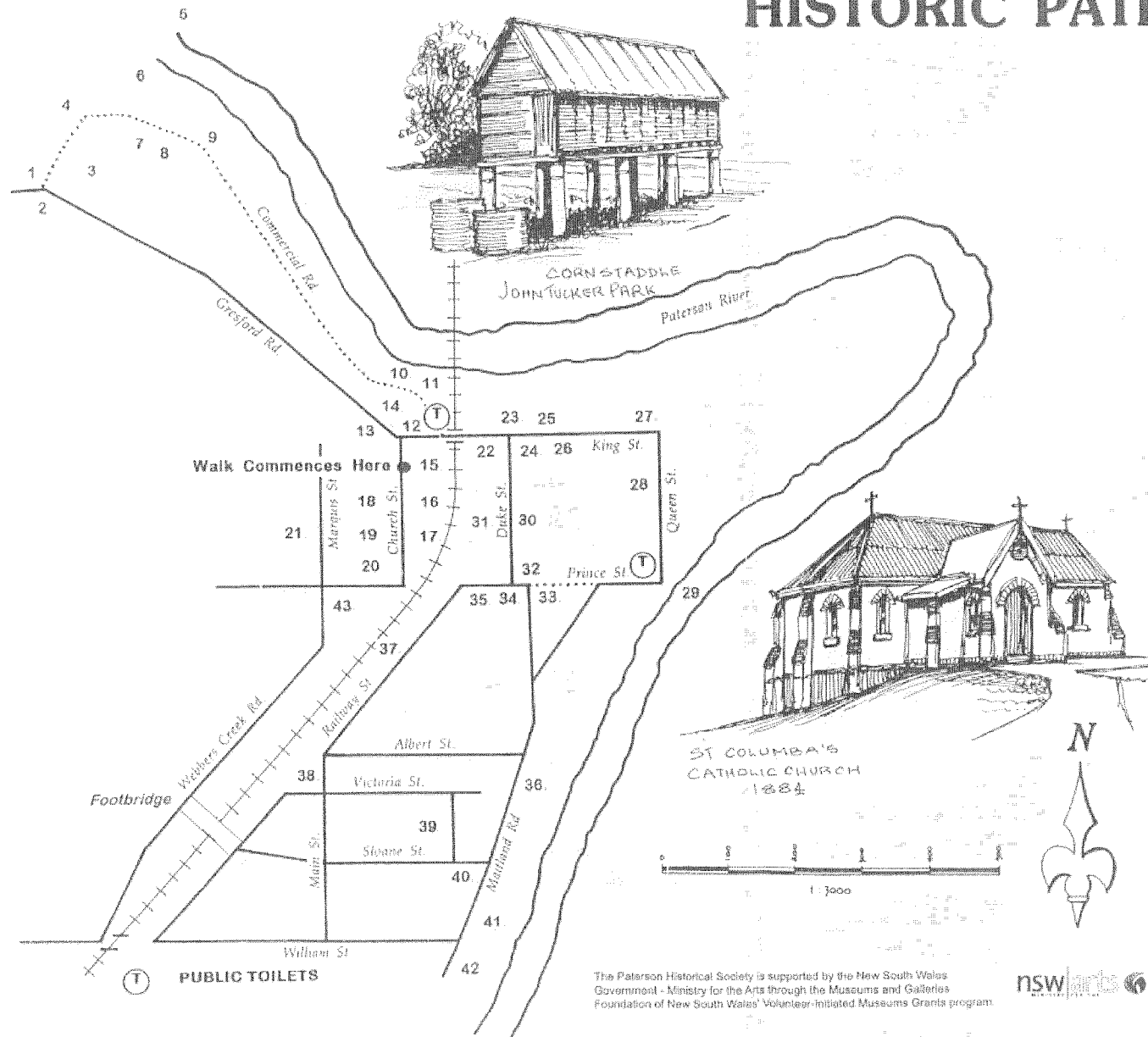


HISTORIC PATERSON
