Mayor's message


It's been a great start to 2025, with a record-breaking crowd of 16,000 people lining The Levee to ring in the new year. We also hosted a fantastic Australia Day celebration at Maitland Park and two community events at Harold Gregson Reserve: a night of live music at Summer Night Sounds and our Maitland Roller Disco. We have plenty more coming up in our events schedule, including our biggest flagship event, Steamfest which returns 12 and 13 April, before our new winter event, 'Luminous' in June.

I'm proud to say we delivered some major projects for our community this summer including a \$26 million upgrade to the Raymond Terrace Road and Government Road intersection at Thornton, and the new Gillieston Heights Skate Park and Playspace next to Roy Jordan Oval.

Work is also progressing on the new Melville Ford Bridge which is due to finish early spring, the new Thornton Skate Park and upgrades to Maitland Resource Recovery Facility.

Thank you to everyone who helped us mark the 70th anniversary of the 1955 flood in February. It was a significant event for our community, and we were proud to recognise this important milestone.

Maitland Park Playspace

More than 400 people shared their ideas for the expanded playspace, with over 70 per cent of respondents supportive of our concept plan and many in favour of tripling the size of the playspace with water play and adventure play elements. We're currently seeking funding for this project and will continue developing the final design.

We've wrapped up engagement for our Communication and Engagement Strategy and our Community Strategic Plan, *Maitland's Future*.

Major projects

Melville Ford Bridge update

Works have now resumed, and in the coming months, crews will finalise the piers and abutments, build the new bridge deck, and complete the roadworks approaching both ends of the bridge. The current bridge will be closed to traffic until the work is finished in early spring. Adverse weather and river conditions may impact construction timeframes. In addition to the project, Council is exploring the possibility of renaming the bridge to honour former Maitland MP Milton Morris AO. 


Government Road, Raymond Terrace Road intersection

Work on the Government Road and Raymond Terrace Road intersection at Thornton is now complete. Jointly funded by Council and the NSW Government, the \$26 million project has seen a new four-way intersection created, traffic lights installed and both roads widened to two-lanes each direction. It has taken an extended timeframe to complete this project due to frequent weather delays and supply chain issues, and we thank the community for your patience. Gillieston Heights Skate Park and Playspace

The new million-dollar skate park and playspace at Gillieston Heights is officially open. Jointly funded by Council and the NSW Government's Places to Play program, the new skate park features a flow bowl with a key hole transition, waterfall to a deep bowl and a mogul. The existing playspace has also been upgraded with new equipment while a new playspace has been constructed, including nature and water play elements. 
