

### DOES YOUR SCHOOL NEED ASSISTANCE IN COMPLETING AN ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT?

Under the Maitland Schools Environment Program, Maitland City Council is able to assist schools by providing them with resources to complete environmental projects. Each school in the Maitland local government area is able to apply for up to \$200 worth of resources per financial year. Should funds remain towards the end of each financial year, schools may be able to request further resources.

Applications for funding assistance can be made at any time. Council aims to purchase and supply requested materials to schools within 2-4 weeks of the request application being submitted. A final assessment report, which is attached, must be submitted on completon of your funded project.

Council also offers many free environmental educational resources to schools. You can enquire and access these resources from Council at any time. Descriptions of some of these resources are detailed on the following page for your information.

### Water Education Through Role Play

Developed with funding from Hunter Water, the kit provides Stage 2 and 3 students with the opportunity to learn about water use and saving water through the performance of in class role plays. The kit provides all scripts and props required to complete the role play activities. The kit also provides mathematical activity sheets suitable for Stage 3 that allow students to work out how much water they and their family use in everyday activities and how simple changes can save water and money on future bills.

Developed as a part of the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage Clean Air Healthy Communities- Local Air Education Project Funding Grant this workbook aims to increase awareness of the environmental and health benefits of cycling to school and to promote and encourage the use of cycle pathways around the Maitland area. The kit has been developed for use by Stage 3 students.
