SHIPPING CONTAINERS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The terms and conditions for use of shipping containers placed on a local public road follow:

- 1. Shipping containers are considered as part of a Work Zone Application only. Note: Generally considered for building construction/ renovation sites to have temporary storage where required.
- 2. Documentation to be included with Work Zone application are a Traffic Control Plan, and Public Liability Insurance; a Statement of Purpose for the use of the container, and dimensions of the container must be provided including width, length and height (in metres).
- 3. Unless approved otherwise, placement of shipping containers on a road reserve/public place will only be permitted for a maximum of seven (7) days and only if the placement of such container is not possible within the applicant's site.
- 4. Unless approved otherwise, a shipping container must be on the public road carriageway and not on the footway.
- 5. The shipping container must be placed so there is at least 3 metres of the road alongside the container that is clear for other vehicles to pass. Note: a) The road must allow for designated on-road cycleways; and, b) Vehicles include service vehicles e.g. Waste collection trucks.
- 6. All shipping containers placed in a public place shall be marked so as to provide maximum safety to residents, pedestrians and other road users. E.g. flashing yellow lights and/or yellow reflective tape.
- 7. Any costs associated with damage caused to the road reserve by the delivery or placement of the container will be borne by the applicant.
- 8. Council reserves the right to require removal of the shipping container based on safety and or environmental grounds. Any removal of a container undertaken by Council will be borne by the applicant.

For further details refer to Council's Work Zone application form.

Notes:

- 1. Any shipping container permitted on the footway must allow for safe pedestrian access.
- 2. If the shipping container is permitted for temporary placement on a footway, the shipping container must be at least 1.2m clear of any 150mm diameter sewer main or 2m clear of any 225mm (or greater) diameter sewer main; and, not be installed over drainage pipes or any house drainage pipelines unless access to the inspection openings is maintained at all times.
